Fun Facts:

- The Egyptians were the first group of people in recorded history to use scarecrows, to protect their wheat fields along the Nile River
- Earl Beal created the first fill-size corn maze in Annville, Pennsylvania, in 1993.
- According to Guinness World Records, the biggest corn maze ever created was 63 acres and located in California.
- Agritourism-related revenues increased 28% from an estimated \$989 million in 2018 to an estimated \$1.08 billion in 2021.
- As of 2023, the Ga. Dept of Ag. listed over 430 registered agritourism attractions. Gilmer, Fulton, Hall, Henry and White counites each had 10 or more registered agritourism attractions. The largest category was pick-your-own- farms, with 42 locations

- Use Candy Corn to Make a Maze
