Fun Facts:

- According to the University of Georgia Center for Agribusiness and Economic Development, greenhouses are the No. 7 commodity by value in Georgia at \$444 million.
- Greenhouses, which make up 50% of Georgia's ornamental horticulture industry, certainly bring in plenty of "green." Investing in these facilities supports year-round cultivation of fresh fruits and vegetables and opens up new job opportunities across our state.
- The first greenhouse was built in Rome in 30 A.D. for Emperor Tiberius, who was advised to eat a cucumber daily. It featured stone walls for insulation and glass ceilings for sunlight.
- There are over 70,000 plant species used in herbal traditions, but only about 3,000 are cultivated commercially.
- Cilantro (Coriandrum sativum) is the most commonly used herb in the world. It's a key ingredient in many cuisines, including those of Latin America, South and Southeast Asia, and Mexico.
