TIFTON: GEORGIA'S OFFICIAL STATE SOIL

The official state soil of Georgia is Tifton, named after the city of Tifton in Tift County. It's found in the Southern Coastal Plain and is great for farming, covering 27% of Georgia's farmland. Crops like cotton, peanuts, soybeans, and corn grow well in Tifton soil. The topsoil is dark, and the subsoil is sandy and clay-like. Tifton soil also has special rocks called ironstone and plinthite. It formed from old sea sediments.
